Indian Lentil Balls

Makes about 30–35 balls



Ingredients

To blend			To stir in			
	250 g	red lentils		1 tsp	fennel seed	
	1 small	onion		1 tbsp	ground flaxseed	
	1 small clove	garlic		1 tsp	baking powder	
	¹⁄₄ tsp	chili or paprika powder		¹⁄₄ tsp	salt	
	1 stalk	lemon grass (available in Asian food shops)				

Method

- Soak the lentils in plenty of water for at least 4 hours. Drain the water in a sieve.
- Peel the onion and garlic and chop finely. Cut off the upper and lower ends of the lemon grass and chop the rest finely. Blend lentils, onion, garlic, chili/paprika powder, and lemon grass with a hand blender.
- Add fennel seeds, ground flaxseed, baking powder, and salt and mix everything using a spoon.
- Preheat the oven to 200 °C upper and lower heat.
- Form the mixture into balls about the size of table tennis balls, brush with a little bit of rapeseed oil, bake for 20 minutes and, if to be eaten cold as finger food, allow to cool down before inserting the toothpicks.

Indian Lentil Balls

Makes about 30-35 balls



Ingredients

To blend				To stir in			
	250 g	red lentils		1 tsp	fennel seed		
	1 small	onion		1 tbsp	ground flaxseed		
	1 small clove	garlic		1 tsp	baking powder		
	¹⁄₄ tsp	chili or paprika powder		¹⁄₄ tsp	salt		
	1 stalk	lemon grass (available in Asian food shops)					

Method

- Soak the lentils in plenty of water for at least 4 hours. Drain the water in a sieve.
- Peel the onion and garlic and chop finely. Cut off the upper and lower ends of the lemon grass and chop the rest finely. Blend lentils, onion, garlic, chili/paprika powder, and lemon grass with a hand blender.
- Add fennel seeds, ground flaxseed, baking powder, and salt and mix everything using a spoon.
- Preheat the oven to 200 °C upper and lower heat.
- Form the mixture into balls about the size of table tennis balls, brush with a little bit of rapeseed oil, bake for 20 minutes and, if to be eaten cold as finger food, allow to cool down before inserting the toothpicks.
